Program Description

The Secondary Education emphasis in Spanish at Utah Tech allows students to immerse themselves in any Spanish-speaking culture. They will be able to use these necessary skills for research, translating and teaching not only the language, but also the literature and the culture of Spanish-speaking country. Traditionally, Spanish major students work as elementary or secondary education teachers. Our location in Utah, a state that is a pioneer in Dual Language Immersion, makes our program a great recruitment place for school districts, not only in our state, but also across the country.

Professional Licensure/Certification (PLC) Requirements

The curriculum for programs at Utah Tech University leading to professional licensure are designed to prepare students for Utah licensure and certification requirements. Admission into programs for professions requiring licensure and certification does not guarantee that students will obtain a license or certificate. Licensure and certification requirements are set by agencies that are not controlled by or affiliated with the University, and licensure and certification requirements can change at any time.

- Complete 16 credits of ESL courses listed below (grade B or higher)
- Complete ESL 2750 or ESL 2760 (grade B or higher).
- Submit one of the following test scores required for unconditional Utah Tech admission: TOEFL (61 iBT, 173 CBT, or 500 PBT); or Michigan (70); or USU-IELE equivalent score. Other tests may be accepted for admission to Utah Tech but will not fulfill this requirement. Official scores must be submitted to the Registrar's Office.

Introductory Information to Spanish Degree

Students can begin taking the required courses for the Spanish major in one of three ways:

1. By beginning with any of the lower division courses (SPAN 1010, 1020, 2010, or 2020), depending on a student's background. Students who begin with 1020, 2010, or 2020 may receive vertical credits for the lower classes, if needed, according to policy.
2. By beginning with SPAN 3010 for heritage Spanish speakers¹. If needed, students can receive vertical credits for the classes skipped, according to policy (catalog.utahtech.edu/academicpoliciesandprocedures/#extrainstitutionalcredittext).
3. By beginning with SPAN 3060 for native speakers¹ or students who have lived in a Spanish speaking environment for 1.5 years or more. If needed, students can receive vertical credits for the classes skipped, according to policy.

The Bachelor of Arts foreign language requirement may be filled with any of these three options as soon as the student receives credit for either SPAN 2020 or SPAN 3060.

Placement in foreign language classes is at the discretion of the Department Chair.

and students must pass the appropriate PRAXIS II content area subject test(s). In addition, one of the following must be completed:

- Students with BA/BS degrees in progress must have completed at least 95% of major coursework and have approval of major academic content area department advisor
- Students with completed BA/BS or higher degrees must have their transcripts reviewed by content area department advisor

You are a "native speaker" if the primary language spoken at home was Spanish and you graduated from a high school where the language of instruction was Spanish.
- ² If a student's native language is Spanish, SPAN 3010 cannot be counted towards requirements.
- ³ Each course can only be used once to fulfill program requirements

Graduation Requirements

1. Complete a minimum of 120 college-level credits (1000 and above).
2. Complete at least 40 upper-division credits (3000 and above).
3. Complete at least 30 upper-division credits at Utah Tech for institutional residency.
4. Cumulative university GPA 3.0 or higher.
5. Grade C or higher (not C-) in each Core Discipline and Emphasis course.
6. USBE R277-504-3 A(3) "requires candidates to maintain a cumulative university GPA of 3.0, and receive a C or better in all education related courses and major required content courses"
7. 3.0 GPA in program prerequisite and professional Education and Secondary Education courses.

- Students entering SPAN 3060 (p. 6) (native Spanish-speaking students and those with a minimum of 1.5 years exposure)

Graduation Plan for students beginning with SPAN 1010

This graduation plan is designed for students who begin studying Spanish with no or very little background in the language. If a student has sufficient background to skip a class or even the beginning year, this plan will become easier. Students who will have the background to skip into a higher class will be those who have had multiple years of high school Spanish, including those who have taken AP Spanish. In these cases, speak with the department chair for placement advice.
